# Preschool Lesson After the Resurrection Jesus Appears to Two Men Luke 24

Jesus conquered death and gives new life. He opens the eyes of our hearts so that we can believe in Him as our Savior.

In this passage Jesus teaches us that all of the Bible tells us about Him.

Introducing the Lesson: Have your child feel something that they can't see – in a bag, or wearing a blindfold. After they identify the object have them describe it.

The two men knew they were walking with a man, they just couldn't describe Him as the Savior. These two men saw Jesus with their eyes but they didn't know who He was. Their hearts were blind until Jesus revealed who He was to them – here Jesus reveals Himself in the Lord's Supper.

# Tell the Bible story from the curriculum. Then ask questions. Listening + saying = learning Questions to ask consider:

- 1. What day did this story take place? Easter evening
- 2. Who are the two men in our story? One is Cleopas and the other man is unnamed.
- 3. Where did the two men begin their long walk? They had been in Jerusalem.
- 4. Where were the two men going when they left Jerusalem? To Emmaus, a town 7 miles away
- 5. What surprised the men as they walked along? A man they didn't recognize came up behind them and joined them.
- 6. Did the two men know the man was Jesus? No, the truth was hidden from their eyes.
- 7. Why were the men surprised when Jesus asked them what they were talking about? The men assumed that everybody knew about the death of Jesus.
- 8. What did Jesus teach them about as they walked? Jesus told them how the OT taught all about the Messiah.
- 9. What happened when the three men arrived in Emmaus? The two men invited Jesus to dinner.
- 10. What did Jesus do to reveal Himself to the men? He prayed, broke bread and gave them wine.
- 11. What did the two men do after dinner? They ran back to Jerusalem to tell His disciples and the others that they had been with Jesus.
- 12. Why were the two men too excited to wait until morning? Now they knew that Jesus truly was alive and death did not keep Jesus in the tomb.

# Lesson Ten

### Jesus Appears to Two Men

## Heart Preparation & Bible Background

As Cleopas and another follower of Jesus walked along the road to Emmaus, the risen Lord Jesus joined them. They were not able to recognize him, and when he asked them what they were discussing, they unburdened their hearts to the seeming stranger.

They told him all about Jesus of Nazareth and their dashed hopes. Now that the powerful prophet had been put to death, who would redeem Israel from Roman rule and bring in the kingdom of God? Yes, it was reported that angels had told some women that he was alive, and some disciples had found the tomb empty, but where was *he*?

As they walked along, Jesus listened closely to the troubled men. Then he began to speak, opening up to them the truth of God's Word. He reminded them that the Christ had to suffer and die so that he could destroy the power of death for his people, and thus enter into his glory. Jesus went on to explain all that had been written about him in the Scriptures.

It was no wonder, then, that Cleopas and his companion didn't want the stranger to leave them; he was bringing comforting good news from God's Word. So they begged him to stay with them when they reached their destination.

As Jesus served them bread and they are together, God opened the eyes of the two men and they recognized the risen Lord himself. Then the men knew why their hearts burned with hope and joy as Jesus revealed the Scriptures to them along the road.

Jesus vanished when the men recognized him. But after seeing him, Cleopas and his friend could not remain in the village a moment longer. They hurried back to Jerusalem to tell the 11 disciples and others the good news concerning Christ. Faith in the risen Lord was beginning to take root in the hearts and minds of the women at the tomb, Cleopas and his companion, and Peter and the other disciples. Jesus had not left them. He had *risen* from the dead, just as he said, to save his people from their sins.

We can rejoice that the risen Savior is with us as well. Christ, who is seated at the right hand of his Father in heaven, sends his Spirit to abide with his people. May our faith be rooted in our glorified Lord and King, the power of his Word, and his abiding presence in our lives.

When they reached Emmaus, Cleopas and his friend said, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening; the day is almost over." So Jesus went in with them.







## From Luke 24 Continuing the Resurrection Appearance Stories Jesus Meets Two Men on Easter Evening, The Gospel in 7 Miles

**Introduction:** We celebrated Easter two weeks ago. There were a lot of things that happened on that first Easter. Women went to the tomb and saw angels. Men went to the tomb and saw angels. Mary was the first person to see the risen Jesus on that first Easter morning. She was crying and Jesus said, "Mary." Jesus knows our names. Now it is evening. Jesus joins two men who don't recognize Him at first either.

It was Sunday and Jesus was alive. He had conquered death. Jesus had paid for sins and now He was alive again. Jesus had spoken to Mary as she wept outside the tomb. He had said her name, "Mary." And she knew it was Jesus. Her heart leapt with joy.

Now it was early evening and two of Jesus' disciples were walking from Jerusalem and going to Emmaus. It was about a seven-mile walk. The name of one man was Cleopas. The Bible doesn't tell us the name of the other man. As the two sad and gloomy men walked along the road they talked about the events that led up to Jesus' death on the cross. As they were talking a third man came and joined them. "What are you talking about?" He asked them.

They looked at Him and Cleopas asked: "Are You the only person in Jerusalem who does not know what has happened?" Jesus looked at the two men and asked, "What things?" The two men began telling Him about Jesus of Nazareth. They said He was a prophet of the Lord who did great wonders for all the people to see. He was handed over to the priests to be put to death.

The men said, "We hoped Jesus would save us from the unfair Roman rulers over us. But this morning some women went to the tomb and it was empty! His body was missing! Some of our friends went to the tomb and reported that it really was empty!"

Jesus looked at the two man and said, "How foolish you are not to believe what the prophets said would happen many years ago. They said the Messiah would have to suffer before rising to glory." Then He explained all about how the Bible, beginning with Moses, taught about the Savior. The two travelers were quite surprised. They were amazed that He knew so much. He quoted scripture and knew all about the prophets. These men had studied the Bible. They knew the stories of Moses and the other prophets. In their heads they knew a lot.

As they got close to Emmaus the two men invited Him to stay with them and eat. Finally Jesus agreed. As they ate the third Man took the bread, He asked that the Lord would bless it, He broke it and gave it to them. Immediately God opened their eyes to see that the Stranger was Jesus Himself! He was not a Stranger at all! It was Jesus who had really been raised from death.

<sup>13</sup>That very day **two** of them were going to a **village** named Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem, <sup>14</sup>and they were talking with each other about all these things that had happened. <sup>15</sup>While they were talking and discussing together, Jesus Himself drew near and went with them. 16 But their eyes were kept from recognizing Him. <sup>17</sup>And He said to them, "What is this conversation that you are holding with each other as you walk?" And they stood still, looking sad. <sup>18</sup>Then one of them, named Cleopas, answered Him, "Are You the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know the things that have happened there in these days?" 19 And He said to them, "What things?" And they said to Him, "Concerning Jesus of Nazareth, a Man who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, 20 and how our chief priests and rulers delivered Him up to be condemned to death, and crucified Him. <sup>21</sup>But we had hoped that He was the one to redeem Israel. Yes, and besides all this, it is now the third day **since** these things happened. <sup>22</sup>Moreover, some women of our company amazed us. They were at the tomb early in the morning, <sup>23</sup> and when they did not find His body, they came back saying that they had even seen a vision of angels, who said that He was alive. <sup>24</sup>Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but Him they did not see." <sup>25</sup>And He said to them, "O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! <sup>26</sup> Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into His glory?" <sup>27</sup>And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, He interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself.


