Luke 10:20-37 The Parable of the Good Samaritan

...a lawyer stood up and **put** Jesus to the **test** saying: "Teacher what shall I do to inherit eternal life?"

Jesus said to him, "What is written in the **Law**? How do you read it?"

And the lawyer answered: "You shall **love** the Lord your God with all your **heart** and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself."

And Jesus said to him, "**You** have answered correctly, do this and you will live."

...he said to Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?"

³⁰In **reply** Jesus said: "A **man** was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he fell into the hands of robbers.

They stripped him of his clothes, **beat** him and went away, leaving him half dead.

³¹A **priest** happened to be going down the same road, and when he **saw** the man, he passed **by** on the other side.

³²So too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side.

³³But a Samaritan, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took **pity** on him.

³⁴He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, took him to an **inn** and **took** care of him.

³⁵The **next** day he took out two silver coins and gave them to the innkeeper. 'Look after him,' he said, 'and when I return, I will reimburse you for any **extra** expense you may have.'

³⁶"Which of these **three** do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?"

³⁷The **expert** in the law replied, "The one who had **mercy** on him."

Jesus replied, "Go and do likewise."

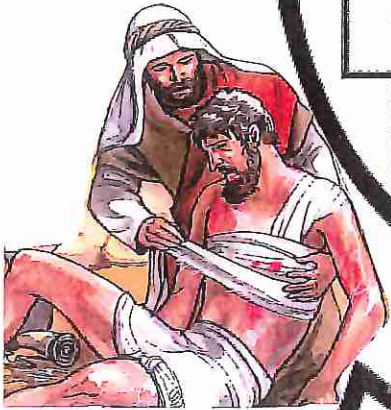
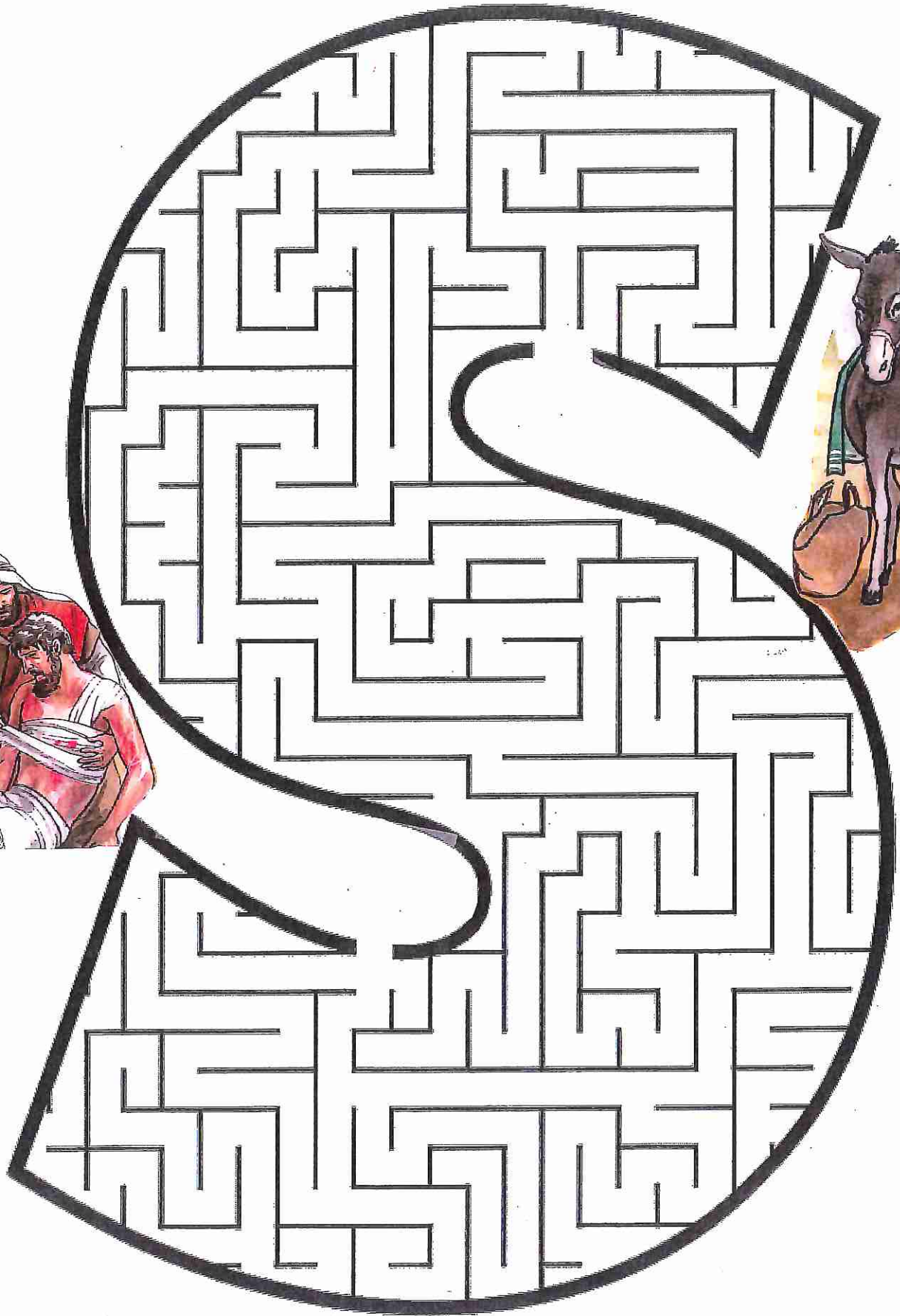
Jesus is the Good Samaritan.

Jesus is the law keeper. He never sinned.

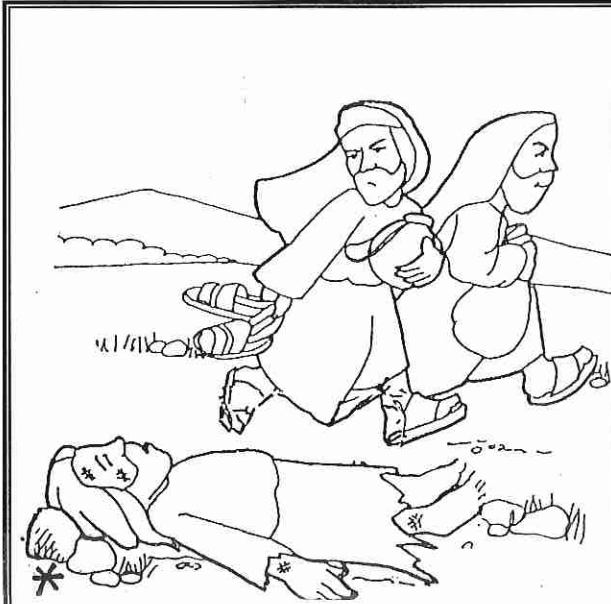
He kept the law perfectly. He gives us His righteousness. His perfection is given to us.

JESUS TELLS A STORY ABOUT LOVE
