16	For we did not follow cleverly devised (made up) myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of His majesty.	What is a myth? Why is it important that the Bible is not a myth? What is an eyewitness? What did the disciples see?
17	For when He received honor and glory from God the Father, and the voice was borne to Him by the Majestic Glory, "This is My beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased,"	Who spoke? What 2 things did He want everyone to know about Jesus?
18	we ourselves heard this very voice borne from heaven, for we were with Him on the holy mountain.	Where were they when they heard God speak to them? Who were they with?
19	And we have the prophetic word more fully confirmed, to which you will do well to pay attention as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts,	What does he say God's Words are like? Why is it good to pay attention to light when things around you are dark? Where does God's Word end up?
20	knowing this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture comes from someone's own interpretation.	What does the word interpretation mean? Why shouldn't you decide what God's Word means?
21	For no prophecy was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.	Where does understanding come from?

What is the greater meaning of this passage of Scripture?

How do these verses challenge us to be better Bible students?
